




Tele-IBH Assessment Baseline Summary Data– Three Strongest Areas

The practice is utilizing relevant billing codes/modifiers to maximize revenue for tele-IBH (e.g. CR modifier)

The practice can collect data to track tele-IBH visits (e.g. visit type, provider, WHO)

The IBH clinician documents in the FHR while conducting a tele-IBH session






Tele-IBH Assessment Baseline Summary Data– Least Developed Areas

The practice has put policies and procedures into place that allow access to tele-IBH for patients with disabilities and other access challenges (e.g. patients without computers...

The practice has a process for assessing patient readiness and providing necessary patient education regarding tele-IBH

The practice has policies and procedures about when and why to use telehealth for IBH

• Who is eligible to participate?

If you are over the age of 18 and have received some substance use or mental health counseling ("behavioral health care") through your primary care provider location, you may be eligible for the group.

. What are we discussing?

We are looking to see how patients experience integrated behavioral healthcare. We want to understand what is going well, and what could be improved from a patient's perspective. By participating, you would be agreeing to share your experiences with a small group, where we all agree to keep the information private. This is a research study being conducted by Brown University. Your health care provider is not involved in the study, and participation will not impact your care.

What is the compensation?

We will be providing \$50 in compensation for participation in the form of a gift card.

COVID-19 Precautions:

All interviews will be conducted remotely, over video call using Zoom, or by telephone.
