Medicaid Pediatric Healthcare Recovery Program

- Will provide stabilization funds, as well performance based payments to Pediatric and Family Medicine providers
- Designed to ensure all children are up to date with the full array of essential, preventive healthcare services, including developmental, psychosocial, and behavioral screenings, by overcoming COVID-19 related barriers to access.
- FQHC's are not eligible
- Payout is based on the number of Medicaid covered patients under 18 years of age in the practice's pediatric panel.

Application and Data Submissions

- Application (including Financial Agreement and Attestation) is due March 9th
- If you need more time Baseline Data is due March 15th
- Links for submitting data can be found

 - Within the application

- Patient population is Medicaid only patients

Practice Assistance

- Real time calculation to determine practice eligibility for payment based on achievement: HEDIS benchmark and / or improvement method
- Practice Specific KIDSNet Immunization/Lead Screening information (payment not contingent on performance)
- Practice Facilitation support:
 - Practice specific Practice Facilitation virtual meetings to review well child and immunization data and discuss quality improvement action plans.
- Learning Sessions and/or Technical Assistance: learning opportunities to assist with psychosocial and behavioral health assessment/intervention

Practices must attend at least one of these 3 Learning Sessions for psychosocial and behavioral health assessment/intervention or individual sessions can be scheduled

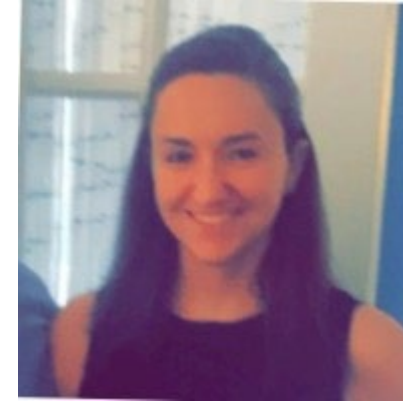

Example of targets and performance for Practice ABC Pediatrics

Baseline Weighted 2021 Performance = 40%

HEDIS Weighted Target = 56.9%

Scenario 1:

Practice ABC Pediatrics April reporting weighted Performance = 41.5%

- Does practice meet target based on the HEDIS Cut point? No. HEDIS Target for Q1 = 42.68% (56.9 * 0.75).
- Does practice meet target based on 2.5% improvement over 2021 Baseline Performance? Yes. Baseline Improvement Target for April Reporting = 41% (40% * 1.025), so the 41.5% attained achieves the performance improvement target.
