





Race-Based Medicine

Race-based medicine refers to the practice of using an individual's racial or ethnic background as a factor in clinical decision-making, including diagnosis, treatment, and medication dosing.

TUSKEGEE SYPHILIS STUDY



Study conducted by United
States Public Health Service and
the Centers for Disease Control
on nearly 400 African American
men with syphilis. Purpose of
study: to observe effects of
disease when untreated, though
by end of study it was treatment.
More than 100 participants died.
They were not informed of the
nature of the experiment.
