Year 2 Medicaid Pediatric Healthcare Recovery Program

- Will provide financial incentives to Pediatric and Family Medicine providers
- Designed to ensure all children are up to date with the full array of essential, preventive healthcare services, including immunizations, lead screening, and developmental, psychosocial, and behavioral screenings, by overcoming COVID-19 related barriers to access.
- Payout is based on the number of Medicaid covered patients under 18 years of age in the practice's pediatric panel.
- FQHC's are not eligible

Application Submission

- Application (including Financial Agreement and Attestation) is due 3 weeks after release.
- [Performance Improvement Plan](#) – due same time
 - Intended to help practices think about Immunization and Lead Screening improvement methods
 - Aid Practice Facilitator discussions with practices

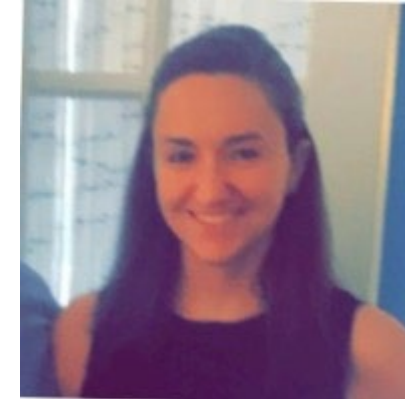

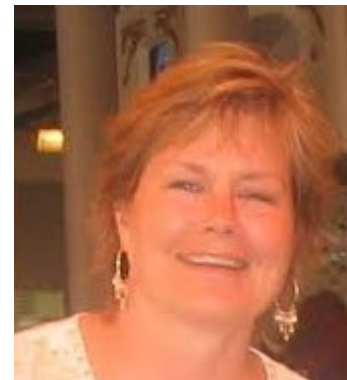

Measurement Specification Document

Must meet 3 out of 4 Measures

Example

Kindergarten Vaccine Readiness Targets	
January 15, 2022	79.1%
April 15, 2023	83.7%
July 30, 2023	88.4%
October 15, 2023	93.0%

Scenario 1:

- Practice baseline for Kindergarten Vaccine Readiness is 70%.
- The practice's improvement targets for this measure would be 75% as of January 15, 2023, 80% as of April 15, 2023, 85% as of July 15, 2023, and 90% as of October 15, 2023.

Scenario 2:

- Practice baseline for Kindergarten Vaccine Readiness is 75%.
- The practice's improvement targets for this measure would be 80% as of January 15, 85% as of April 15, 2023, 90% as of July 15, 2023, and 95% as of October 15, 2023.
- These improvement targets are *higher* than the performance targets for this measure (as listed in the table above) so the practice would be evaluated based on whether it achieved the performance targets, not the improvement targets.

KIDSNET Hints

- Handling Out-of-state Immunizations
- Removing children not seen in practice
- Lead Screening reports
- Immunization past due report \neq Readiness
 - Example: 5 year old missing immunizations might not be past due, but would not be ready for Kindergarten
